Coastline Regional Occupational Program (ROP) is focused on the health and safety of all students and staff members. In an effort to provide a high-quality educational experience for students and to minimize exposure to the COVID-19 virus, Coastline ROP has developed an Instructional Plan. This plan is based on what is currently known about COVID-19, as provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), the Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA), and guidance cited by the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE).


WE ARE BETTER TOGETHER



K-12 students are required to wear a mask indoors unless there is a medical exemption allowing for a non-restrictive alternative. Adults in K-12 settings are required to wear a mask when sharing indoor spaces with students.



Frequently wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and use hand sanitizer.



Social distancing is encouraged but not required.



Keep shared spaces clean.



Screen for symptoms at home: Fever (>100.4), Sore Throat, Congestion/Runny Nose, Nausea/Vomiting, Diarrhea, Headache, Fatigue/Muscle or Body Aches, Cough, Difficulty Breathing, Loss of Taste/Smell. Stay home when sick.

SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Exposure and Possible Quarantining of Asymptomatic Close Contacts

(Close contact is more than 15 minutes in a 24-hour period within six feet, regardless of masking.)

- **Asymptomatic vaccinated students or documented COVID within 90 days exposed to COVID-19** may continue to attend school as long as they:
 - ◇ Continue to be asymptomatic and screen for symptoms through day 14
 - ◇ Continue to mask
- **Asymptomatic unvaccinated students exposed to COVID-19 where both infected person and exposed person were wearing masks** may undergo a modified quarantine. They may attend school if they:
 - ◇ Continue to be asymptomatic and screen for symptoms through day 14
 - ◇ Continue to mask indoors and outdoors
 - ◇ Undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine. Tests at least three days apart.
 - ◇ Quarantine from all extracurricular activities.
- **Asymptomatic unvaccinated students where either the student or the infected individual was not wearing a mask** may discontinue quarantining under the following conditions:
 - ◇ After day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR
 - ◇ After day 7 with a negative COVID test obtained after day 5 from the date of last exposure.
 - ◇ Continue to mask indoors and outdoors for 14 days

SAFETY PROTOCOLS CONTINUED

Exposure and Isolation of Symptomatic Close Contacts

(Close contact is more than 15 minutes in a 24-hour period within six feet, regardless of masking.)

- **Students experiencing symptoms may not attend school until they have met the following CDPH criteria:**
 - ◇ At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications; and
 - ◇ Other symptoms have improved; and
 - ◇ They have a negative test for SARS-CoV-2, OR a healthcare provider has provided documentation the symptoms are typical of their underlying chronic condition OR a healthcare provider has confirmed an alternative named diagnosis, OR at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset.
